Collaboration

Collaboration is the central pillar by which the college approaches its delivery of education services; we believe this is essential to meeting the skills needs of the industries we serve. The following working practices are in place to facilitate this:

- Work closely with Local Authorities, County Councils, Local Enterprise Partnerships, Employer Representative Bodies, and independent research firms to keep Labour Market Intelligence (LMI) under constant review
- ► Annually **review local and regional skills needs**, evolving our curriculum offer to meet need
- ► Work with other **education providers and agencies** to establish employers needs over a wider geography
- A management infrastructure which allows senior leaders the opportunity to develop 'strategic enabling works' with employers to address skills shortfalls impacting the labour market
- ► Provide **Operational Business Support Services** via our dedicated employer focused team, e.g. supporting recruitment campaigns for apprenticeships, writing of adverts and job descriptions, shortlisting applicants, reviewing insurances, developing tailored training programmes or writing new courses specific to business need
